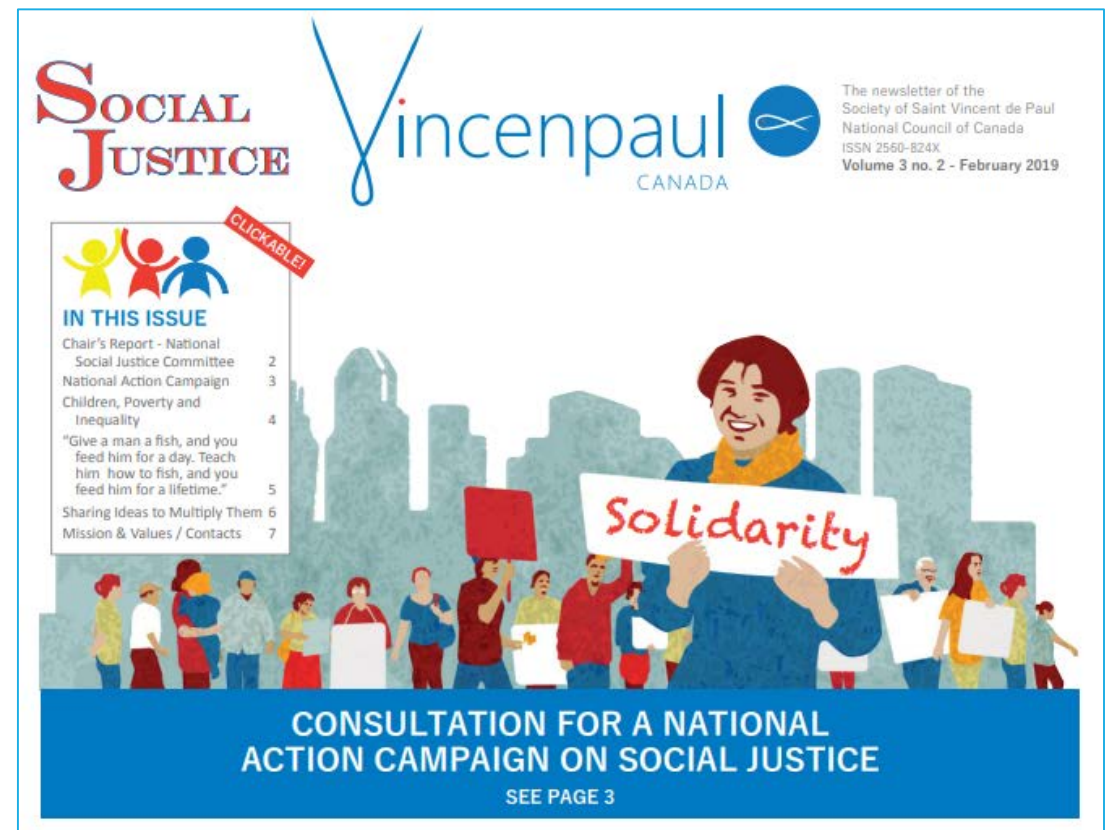

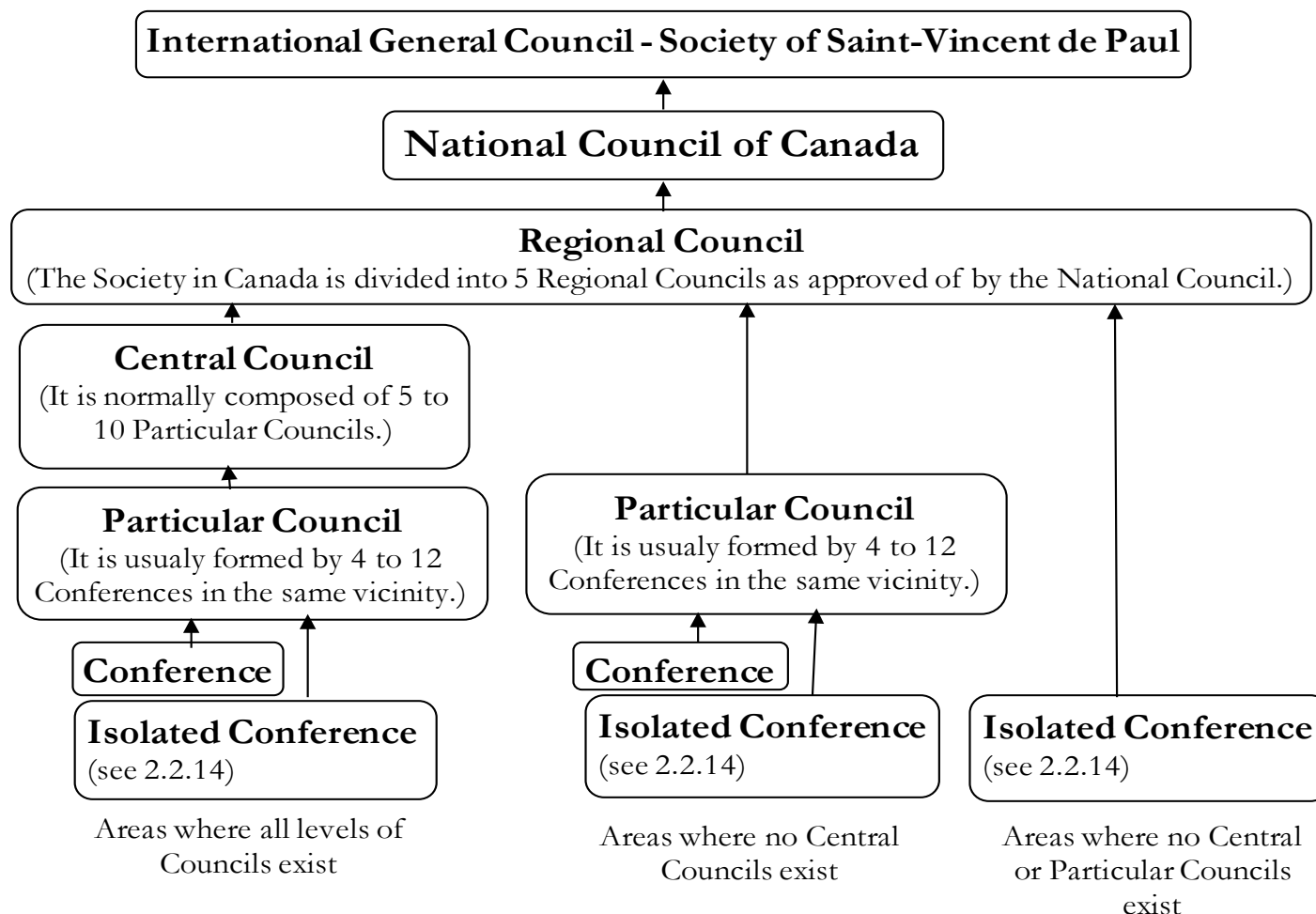

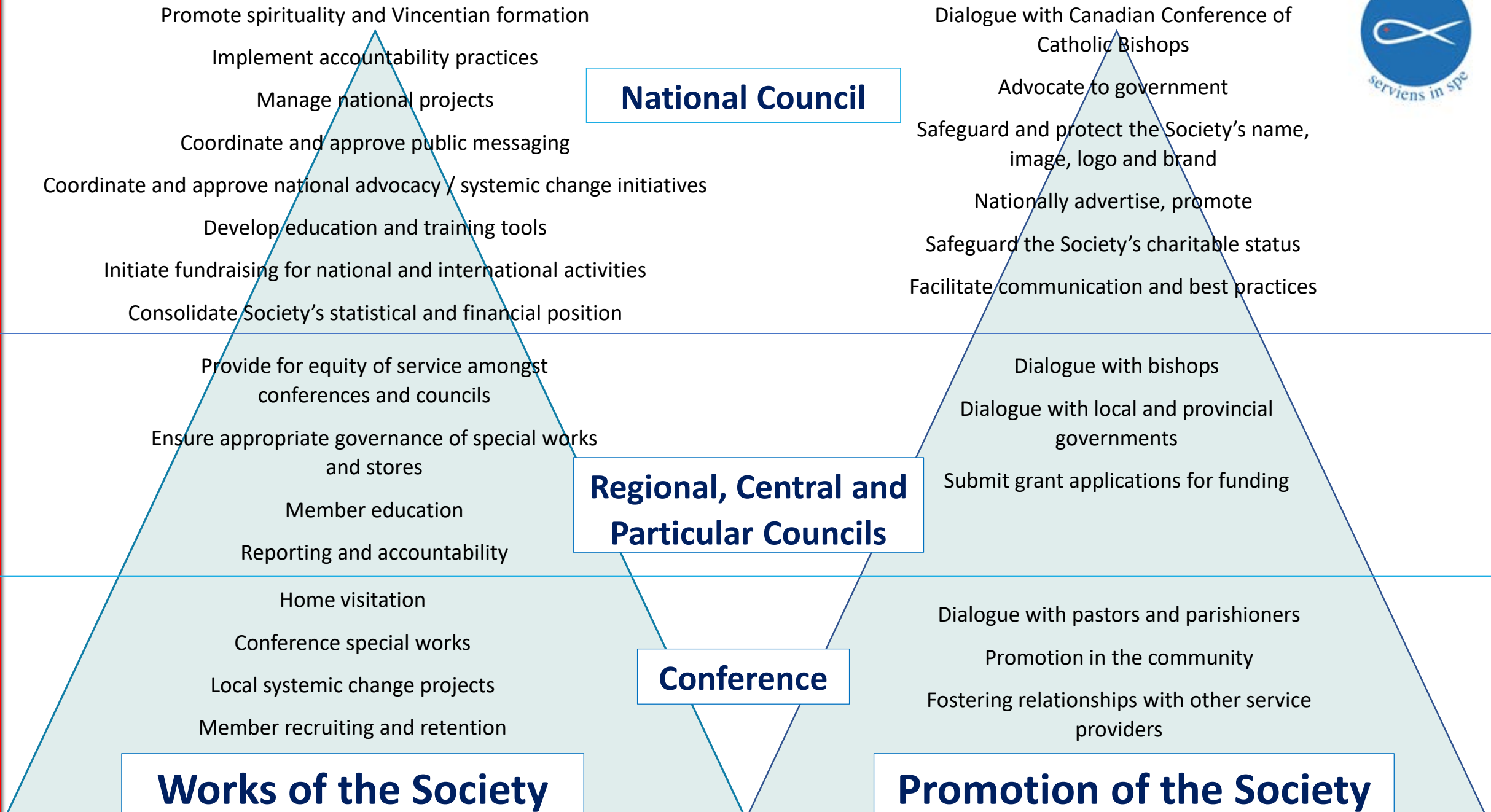

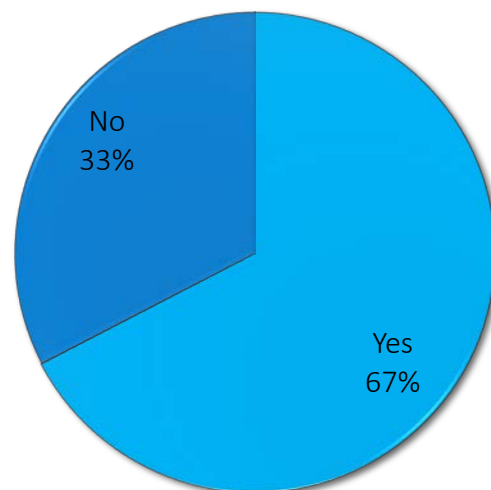


2018 Survey Results on The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul Canada's National Strategic Plan 2015-2020

Question: Have you appointed and trained a Spiritual Advisor for your council or conference?

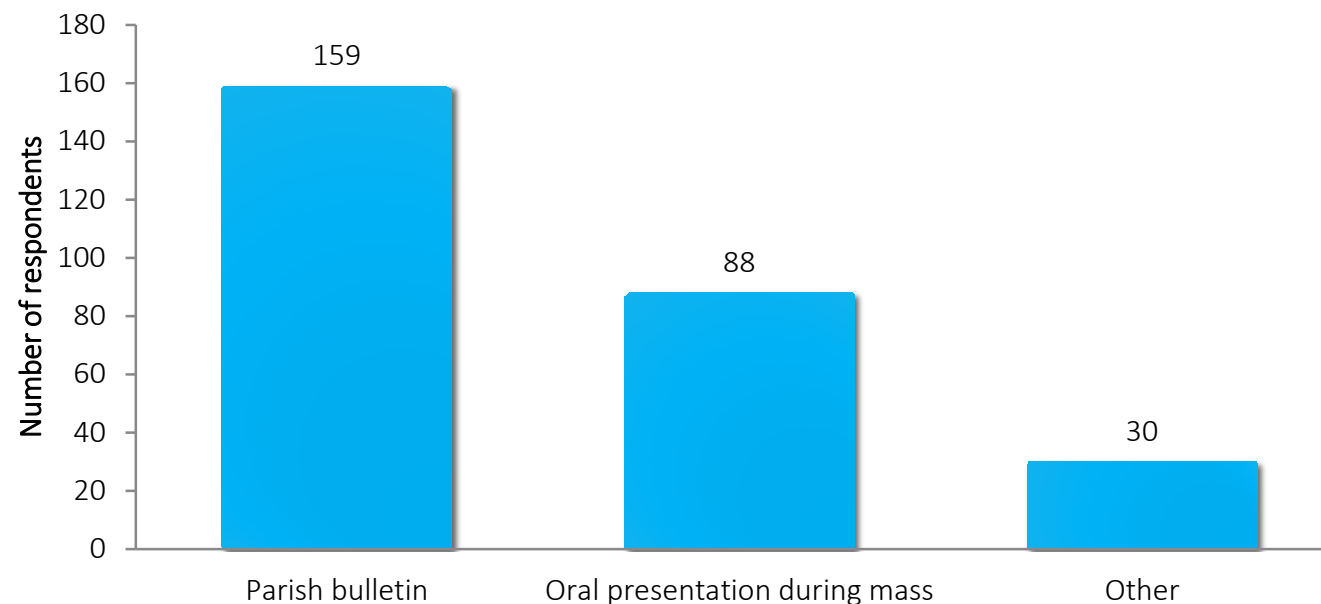

Question: What methods of communication do you use to inform your parishioners of your accomplishments?

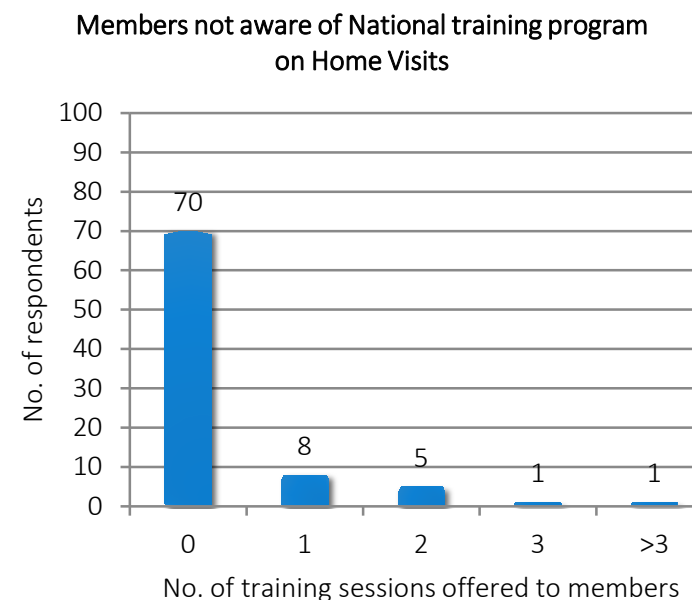
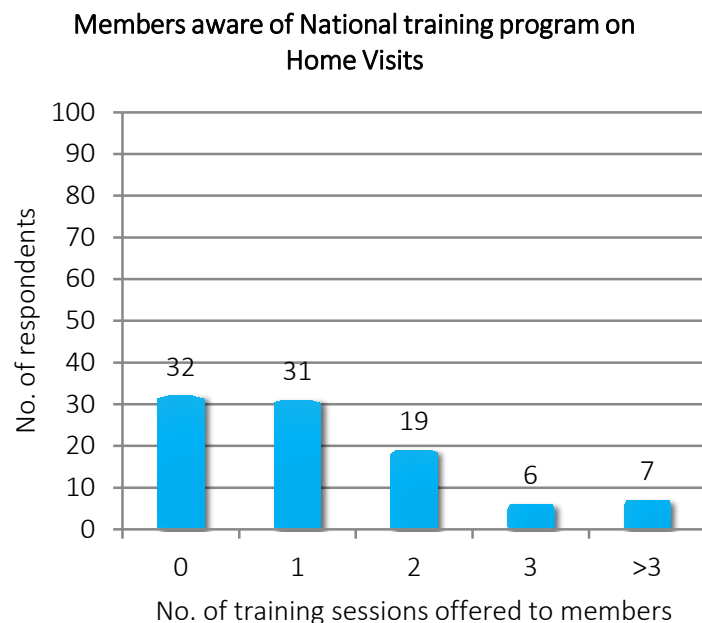

Question: How many Home Visits training sessions have you offered to your members since June 2017?

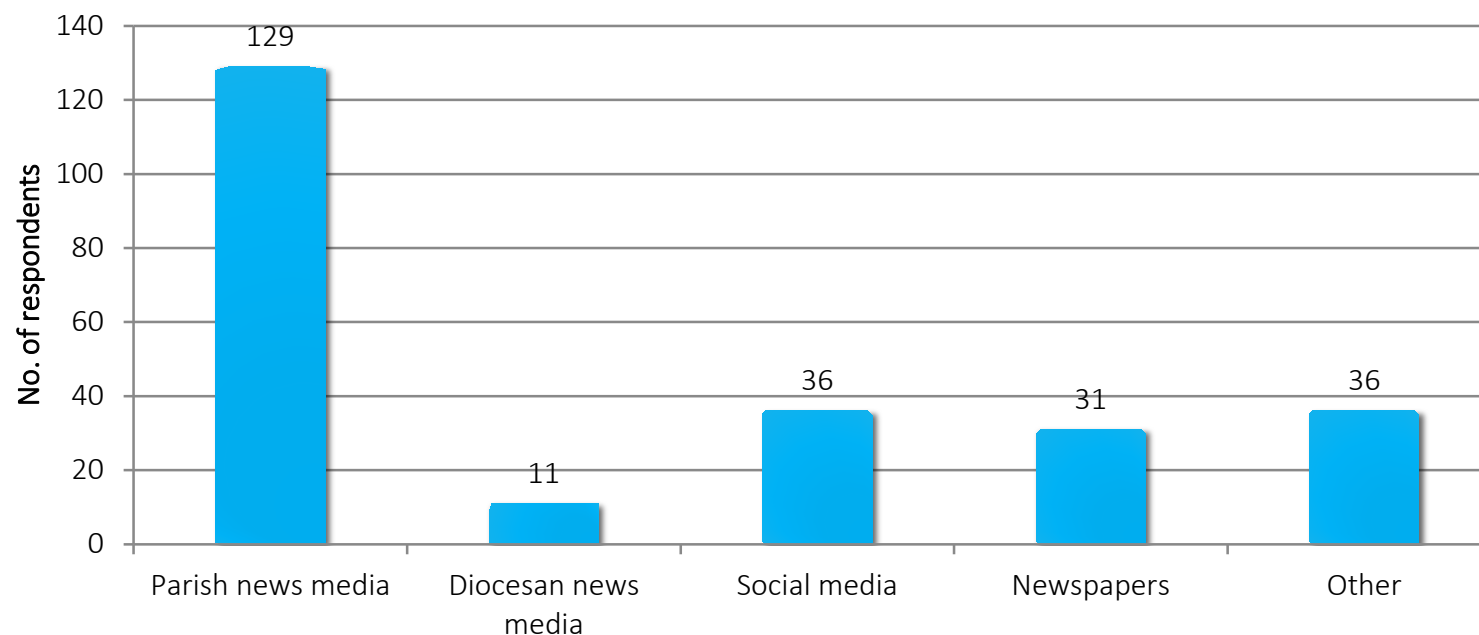
