- where, who they are, & where they exist





Interdependence

The Vincentian Spirit – we strongly believe in our face-to-face contact with struggling families. We do not hesitate to do EVERYTHING that is possible to be of assistance..." in all possible ways."

2016 a teenaged girl in Rankin said to me – "We are a forgotten people"

The Inuit belief - interdependence & co-existence.

The food we share is more than... food. Think of it as the key to opening the door to the beginning a relationship with our northern families. Our opportunity to let them know – They are not a forgotten people AND that we can, "help in all possible ways"

Naujaat still speaks of the KD boxes that the school children wrote a wee note on to say "Hi my name is...!!"

But what can I ... we do....

3 Pillars of Northern Help

Work along side a conference/council that has <u>adopted</u> a community- reach out and ask what you too can <u>gather</u>

A food item, crafts, gently used runners, hoodies, a household product (TP)

Financial support to the North of 60 project

There are many layers: sea can purchase & delivery; transportation to port in Montreal; shipment to the community & barge drop to the beach area

Adoption of a community by a conference/council

The sole responsibility is to <u>gather</u> items for the sea can.. ONLY! The community makes a list and we try to meet those needs.

Time commitment

- Gathering typically begins in the spring in order to be ready for the port's shipment dates.
- Some containers leave in early July others in September.
- As chair of N of 60, all logistics are my responsibility
- I am ready to help throughout the gathering and container loading process

- Dress down day at a high school.... Food & \$\$
