A Moment Of Spiritual Reflection

“Let us do our duty well; let us go straight to God; let us work to become very humble, very patient, very mortified, and very charitable.”

— Vincent de Paul

[Luke 6:20-26](#)

Friends, today's Gospel is Luke's pithy version of the beatitudes. First we are told, *“Blessed are you who are poor.”*

We notice that there is none of the softening offered by Matthew (“poor in spirit”), but a simple and straightforward statement of the blessedness of being poor. How do we interpret what seems prima facie to be a glorification of economic poverty? Let me propose the following reading: “How lucky you are if you are not addicted to material things.” One of the classic substitutes for God is material wealth, the accumulating of “things.”

The freedom and fullness of detachment is probably no better expressed than in John of the Cross' beautiful mantra: *“To reach satisfaction in all, desire satisfaction in nothing; to come to the knowledge of all, desire the knowledge of nothing; to come to possess all, desire the possession of nothing; to arrive at being all, desire to be nothing.”*

This fourfold *nada* is not a negation but the deepest affirmation. It is finally to see the world as it is and not through the distorting lens of cupidity and egotism.

BEYOND THE KITCHEN:

FOOD INSECURITY

Hunger and food insecurity often get used interchangeably but they have different meanings.

Hunger is the feeling when we don't have food to eat whereas food insecurity is a consistent lack of access to adequate and nutritious food to maintain an active and healthy lifestyle.

According to Concern Worldwide (August 2023), the world produces enough food to feed 7.5 billion people and yet more than 10% of the population goes hungry everyday and those numbers are rising.

Globally, some of the causes of food insecurity include War and Conflict (about 60% of people affected by food insecurity live in war and conflict zones around the world), Poverty due to unemployment, inflation and soaring food prices, the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, Climatic changes resulting in flooding and drought, Food waste, Forced Migration and Poor Public policies.

Locally we have seen food insecurity among people living on fixed income and struggling with inflation and high food prices. Some don't have transportation like seniors and people with disabilities and mobility issues. Then there are newcomers to Canada, who are struggling to navigate through the system.

The food banks are not for everyone. Partly some don't qualify, and some feel uncomfortable or embarrassed going to the food banks because of the stigma regarding food bank use.

According to research, people living in food-insecure households are more likely to develop physical health issues like diabetes, hypertension and mental health issues like anxiety and depression.

Charitable organizations including the *Society of St Vincent de Paul* have done a great job in reaching out to those vulnerable people.
