National President's Message

Thank you to the 14,300 amazing Vincentians across Canada who gave over 1.3 million hours of their time to provide help to our friends in need! These are significant increases from a year ago.



With rising costs and more newcomers coming to Canada, the need continues to increase, and Vincentians were able to help and serve 232,700 neighbours in need, including 90,320 children. This too is a large increase from 2022.

The help provided varies depending on the needs of each community. Vincentians visited 162,305 households (12% more than in 2022) of which 11,810 were homeless. We are now tracking visits to unhoused individuals as higher rents and the housing crisis affect more people than ever.

Across the country, SSVP Canada operates many food banks, soup kitchens, shelters and drop-in centres. The numbers of these special works also markedly increased from 2022, emphasizing how crucial our community efforts continue to be.

Blessed Frédéric Ozanam stated, "Yours must be a work of love, of kindness, you must give your time, your talents, yourselves." Thank you for living this every day when you help our friends in need. Keep up the great work!




