PEI Project – What is it?

2020 - Final report of the Special Committee on Poverty in PEI tabled including costed recommendations for a Basic Income Guarantee

2023 - 'A Proposal For a Basic Income Benefit In Prince Edward Island'. This report outlines issues of cost, financing, labour market effects and more. This work was groundbreaking in that it was the first basic income proposal in Canada which studied, modelled, and presented solutions to key issues.





Implementation

Administration

Social assistance is fed/prov

Basic income delivered through federal tax system – what happens when need is developed outside of the federal tax year?

How will basic income will impact the administration of existing programs


Cost

Currently. Social assistance delivered through Nuclear Family model: yearly gross cost in PEI would be M 309

PEI report used Census Family model. Yearly gross cost is 188 million. Net cost aprox M 100

Recent PBO report uses Economic fam y model.

Cost even lower





Implementation

Impact

Currently (2023 report) poverty rate in PEI is at 9.7 %. Using PEI report model, poverty rate would be at 2.1% with everyone lifted out of deep poverty

Labour market displacement: PBO report estimates a reduction of 1.4% less hours worked – less then 1 hour per week.
Studies have shown, people on GBI return to school, learn new skills, can better care for those in need.

Financing

Census family reduces the cost of the program by 40% of previous estimates

There will be savings to income assistance (conservative estimate of \$17.4M) and incometested benefits

Tax increases for highest income earners—modestly increase to cover 1/4 of the cost while ensuring that Islanders with low- and middle-income are better off

Partnership with the federal government



Advocacy – What we've learned



Grass roots lane:

General information: definitions; impact on health, life, sectors. Current system keeps people in poverty.

Policy, informed Political lane:

The PEI project allows us to answer the question 'how to implement': cost, financing, impacts etc.





Advocacy – What we've learned

Know your lane!!



- Identify your audience and understand what type of information they need.
- If you don't know the answer, then reach out to someone who does. We are all learning from each other.
- Details matter
- The PEI project has changed the conversation at all levels. It's important.





Talking Points - examples

Introduction to GBI

- Current system keeps people in poverty
- Current system is not reactive to rapidly changing times
- Benefits of GBI to: health, food security, mental health issues, entrepreneurship
- Reacts to shocks in economy

MPs and Policy Reps

- PEI report has addressed issues of: cost, financing, labour market
- Social support is a fed/prov issue
- Demo project will provide evaluation and administrative data
- We have experts who can follow up with more detail - get another meeting!
