
In his landmark encyclical of 1891,




April 28, 1983

Ozanam defined the St Vincent Conferences:

A Catholic but lay society, humble but numerous, poor but full of poor to relieve; above all in an age in which charitable associations have such a great mission to carry out for the revival of the faith, the support of the Church, for a truce from the hatred which divides men.
